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SMART GOAL

It is the goal of Molino Park Elementary to provide a place where students feel safe and parents want to send their children to learn. The faculty and staff will provide an atmosphere conducive to student learning with clear, fair, and consistent discipline.

SCHOOL-WIDE BEHAVIORAL GOALS

Office Discipline Referrals: It is our goal to decrease the number of office discipline referrals as compared to last year by using the district discipline matrix and our school-wide behavior tracking form.

Out-of-School Suspensions: It is the goal of the faculty and staff of Molino Park to reduce the number of out of school suspensions in the general education population by following the school-wide discipline plan and procedures.

In-School Suspensions: It is our goal to decrease the number of in-school suspensions as compared to last year.

Discipline Disproportionality: It is our goal to analyze our discipline data in order to prevent and/or decrease any discipline disproportionality.

Chronic Absenteeism: Our attendance goal is 95% for the year. The administration, guidance counselor, and teachers will work together to improve attendance for the entire population. Some examples would be child study meetings; conferences; phone calls; and/or sending out the visiting teacher.

Bullying Prevention: Bullying will not be tolerated. Faculty, staff, and students are trained to identify potential bullying situations. All incidents will be reported and investigated by the school administration. Disciplinary action will be taken by the administration if necessary. Interventions will also be put in place.

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TEACHING EXPECTATIONS AND RULES

How will your school introduce the school-wide expectations and rules to all of your students and staff?

Faculty and staff will introduce the school-wide expectations during pre-school planning. Teachers will review the Rights and Responsibility Handbook with students. Classroom rules will be reviewed with students every day the first week of school. The Molino Park Morning Show will show the SOAR expectations daily throughout the year. Teachers will use Thinking Maps and Whole Brain activities.

During the school year, what activities will your school implement to encourage on-going direct instruction of the school-wide expectations and rules? How will your school embed the expectations and rules into the daily curriculum?

The Molino Park Morning Show will show the SOAR expectations daily throughout the year. Classroom rules will be reviewed with students throughout the year. Students can earn positive behavior reports. Good Citizens/Student of the Month recognition each month. Eagle of the Month "Bucket Fillers" program for positive actions and/or words that students use toward others is a school-wide program. Names are drawn out of the bucket each month and students receive a prize for filling others' buckets. Teachers will also incorporate Thinking Maps and Whole Brain activities.

How often will you plan to provide refresher training on expectations and rules to staff and students in your school? How will you orient and teach new students who arrive mid-year?

Refresher trainings are given each year or as needed throughout the year. New students will be paired with a student with A Citizenship, and the classroom teacher will review our school rules and procedures. Teachers will have a "Cheat Sheet" for the Behavior Tracking form steps.
